

TEPPING INTO THESE SPIRIT-CHARGED WATERS WAS risky. I was nervous about the Living Waters Training. True confession: this Catholic seminarian was a little allergic to my Protestant kin. The allergy didn't stand a chance. I had risked much to sin; I needed to risk much to be healed.

There was freedom that week. I recognized it immediately. The simple acts of worship were redemptive for me. Offered countless times on the altars of pornography and homosexuality, my body was washed clean in these waters. It made perfect sense. Jesus was teaching me how to worship Him.

Jesus gives Himself to me with utter abandon. Therefore, He could demand everything from me. I wasn't afraid anymore to surrender to Him, even at the deepest level. It was the next step; He gave me faith that week to get immersed. Jesus imparted a Spirit-charged remedy to my sexuality; would I, could I, trust Him that intimately?

I had lived under the domination of homosexuality. Strangely, I held on to it as an unchanging attribute of Marco. Now I didn't want it anymore. I wanted Jesus to envision me for something greater. I had disqualified myself from so much because of same-sex attraction. I was finally filled to the brim with hope for my inheritance. I'm a man, made in God's image, created for life and love in this masculine body. God's vision for me broke the old vision. The Spirit, hovering over this week, immersed me in His power.

I always had a low-grade anxiety surrounding my gender inadequacy. Jesus broke it that week. He unleashed something that was mine by nature, but forbidden according to the enemy's schemes. Jesus unlocked a new horizon for my masculine gift. Why was I so fixed on being disqualified from man-woman romantic love? Jesus broke that domination, the silencing power of homosexuality — the domination that tried to deem me impotent and unwanted.

Jesus' Cross surely offers a better way. That week accessed it.

I had heard many Catholic speakers, none like Andrew Comiskey. In those sessions, Jesus was waging a war against the enemy of my soul. The power of Andrew's witness and his trust in Divine Mercy was a game-changer. Jesus wanted me to rise and take action in my own healing. He wanted me to set my hand to the plow. Since then, I haven't looked back. That week changed the trajectory of my life. I returned home with a plan to proceed onto wholeness. Jesus met me and called me. I'd have been a fool to not act immediately.



When I surrendered my life to Jesus, I was gayidentified, sexually addicted, and desperately in need of



someone to save me and bring stability. When I cried out to Jesus for mercy, He met me powerfully, but I had no idea what my conversion would mean for my sexual identity and behavior. I wondered if I should surgically remove my sexual organs so that I could have a better chance

of living holy.

In the fog of my confusion, a friend invited me into a Living Waters group. After week one, I called my friend and said I was never going back! I was uncomfortable in a setting where people so freely shared their need for Jesus; I was used to church community far removed from real-life problems. In the mirror of others' painful stories, I saw myself as an out-of-control freak.

I'm so glad I stayed! Week after week, Jesus revealed real wounds underneath my compulsivity. Rather than judgment, I received mercy. In place of confusion, I received a biblical view of my body, gender, and wounds, and a vision of what healthy, loving relationships could look like. Over time, I became a sober-minded follower of Jesus, a man who could offer pure-enough love, free from perversion, and walk out my vocations as husband, father and pastor. Growing up in Vietnam, I was sexually abused as a child. I was labeled as being "effeminate." This toxic

lie veiled my true identity. It made me feel inferior to men and insecure with women. When I allowed myself to have sexual relationship with other men as a young adult, I was acting out of this deep woundedness.

The cultural shame and fear over one's brokenness is over-bearing. One of the keys that I handed over to Jesus to unlock and heal my wounded

heart was in the form of therapy. It felt empowering to learn the language of my wounds: to name them as they are. My therapist recommended Living Waters. In the confidentiality of small groups, we confessed our brokenness and kept each other accountable daily. I discovered my father-wound as well.

Being known and loved by the Living Waters group has been extremely powerful and healing for me. I have emerged from the chaotic waters to discover my true identity as a beloved son of God the Father. How God sees me has set me free. That very truth has helped me to forgive my abusers and myself. This is key to my healing process because it gives God the space to fill my broken heart with His healing grace. All I needed to do was own and empty myself of rubbish—the anger, fear, shame, hatred, and lies acquired over all these years. **DSM**

Ministers spend a lot of time giving out and denying real needs. I identified well with that for most of my life.



The more I gave to the church, the more responsibility I was given. It worked: I was rewarded for being helpful while my service freed me from exposing my brokenness. Coming from a background of sexual abuse, this had become habit for me. I had become accustom to denying

my own emotions, thoughts, and needs, and caring for others' needs above my own.

That looked good at face value and it also built up my church. Denying my brokenness divided my soul further. It also slowly poisoned my love for the church. I began to feel used there as I had in my abuse.

I found Living Waters at a desperate time in my life. In the first few weeks, I was given permission to have need, and given space by God to slow down and let Him and others know my needs and begin to meet them. Jesus showed me that He wanted me to grow dependent upon Him in all areas of my life!

Week after week, He revealed my needs—for security, value, healing, integration, community, honesty, and my need to stand back up in the authority He gives me. He opened me to mercy. Through Living Waters, I've found the One that can not only meet my need, but calls me to be needy. In helping me to accept my weaknesses, He continues to integrate me. He is making me a more authentic gift and better receiver of love—from Him and from others. **DSM**

Several months into the year of lockdowns and quarantine, I headed from Michigan to Kansas on



my first trip since March of 2020. I was hoping to encounter Jesus at the Living Waters Training. The lockdown had been difficult; the isolation and loneliness fed historic triggers that tempted me to send my browser to places that

At that training I brought all of this to the Cross and to my small group. With the help of my leader, I finally experienced my pain though tears and received the healing love of God the Father. I realized that I had been so angry that I could not receive the healing that I wanted. Maybe I didn't even know that I needed healing! Once I let go of the fear and anger, with the help of my group, the tears came, and with them the embrace of my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

It has been 9 months since that training. God has blessed us with our 4th pregnancy and as of today we are 28 weeks along and due I year to the day of that training.
